Context of the school

Kelsall Primary School is approximately 10 miles away from Chester. It is a one form entry school with 207 children on roll. We have high expectations and aspirations for all our pupils and we are committed to ensuring that all pupils are given every chance to realise their full potential.

At Kelsall Primary School, there are a small percentage of pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium Grant (PPG).

Due to the low number in receipt of the grant, Kelsall Primary School does not publish specific results/ spending in each year group/ number of children involved to avoid identifying specific children in a public domain.

Staff at Kelsall are committed to planning 'Quality First Teaching' and learning opportunities that meet our whole school vision of 'A Love for Learning'. Where appropriate, we use the premium to support children in overcoming personal and social barriers to their learning in order to enable them to enjoy, achieve and develop 'A Love for Learning'.

- To support social and emotional learning through creative activities outside of the classroom.
- To provide both curricular and extra-curricular enrichment which links to either social and emotional development or academic progress and attainment.
