

# Friday Flyer – 27<sup>th</sup> October 2023

#### Dear Parent,

I would like to start this Friday Flyer with an important message from our governing body;

Dear Parents/Carers of Kelsall Primary & Nursery School,

As you may be aware, our school was last inspected by **Ofsted in 2011**. In this inspection, we were judged as **'Outstanding'** As governors of the school, in liaison with the school leadership team, the wider school team and the Trust, we have worked tirelessly to build on the school's offer since that inspection and we strongly believe that Kelsall Primary & Nursery School has improved markedly in many respects.

Since that inspection, we have become **Kelsall Primary & Nursery School**, and the provision that the nursery offers is widely considered to be a shining example in terms of its practice within the authority, with several professionals consolidating this opinion when visiting the school. The grounds of the school have been developed extensively, from the Early Years outdoor provision to the playground and MUGA. The school's commitment to creativity and the arts is also highly regarded by wider professionals across the area and the opportunities the children at Kelsall have because of this expertise is over and above that of many other schools. As a school, we are often drawn upon by other schools, teachers and professionals to support their practice and we continue to be highly aspirational for the future of the school and the children within it.

As we consider the coming months and years, which will inevitably include our next Ofsted inspection, we would really like to put across to parents and stakeholders, these successes and the ambition we have for the school going forward. It may not be widely known, but within the education sector, there is a valid shared understanding that more recently, the Ofsted criteria for an outstanding school has elevated greatly:

In 2021-2022, the percentage of *previously outstanding* primary schools which remained outstanding when receiving a graded inspection was **just 14%** (see figure below taken from the Department of Education). In terms of analogy, recently an experienced Ofsted inspector working with schools has likened Ofsted judgements in the following way: 'good' is like a door; 'outstanding' is the keyhole.



We wanted to assure parents that as a school, the leaders, governors and everyone involved have the highest standards and ambitions, and we very much look forward to sharing these with Ofsted when they do indeed come. We hope that you will support Mr Wearing and the Kelsall team going forward in whatever ways you can as parents, as like we have been teaching the children, **'We are a crew'**, and we want everyone to work together to help our school become even better.

# **Contacting School**

As a school we value the importance of having open communication with you via phone, e-mail and School Spider. The following protocols are in place to support you get to the right member of staff to answer you enquiry. If you are contacting the school regarding absence, illness or any other **urgent matter** then please call the school office on; **01829 752811** – the office staff will relay any messages to your child's class teacher or appropriate member of staff. *Please do not e-mail staff directly about absences as these need to be carefully recorded by the school office*.

All teachers can be contacted via e-mail. *This is not something that all schools offer*. The vast majority of schools ask that the office is contacted and then your message passed on. We are finding that lots of e-mails are being sent at the weekend and late into the evening. Please consider the timing of you e-mail and whether it would be better to ask for a phone conversation or face to face meeting. I find it much better to discuss things face to face rather than lots of e-mail exchanges. I will be reviewing our protocols at the end of the next term; staff are keen to keep the systems in place but would appreciate that the e-mail protocols, particularly, are stuck too.

Our e-mail policy is that staff will respond as quickly as possible but **will not** respond **out of school hours or at weekends**. If you have an urgent message over the weekend or in holiday periods then you can e-mail me; <u>principal@kelsall.cheshire.sch.uk</u>

## Attendance Matters

Attendance at school is **important** both academically and for social/emotional reasons. Whilst we understand that pupils will be absent from time to time due to illness; absence from school for other reasons should only be for exceptional circumstances. As a school we look at each request for leave from school on a case by case basis. *Holidays taken in term time will be subject to a fine*. Where *attendance* falls below **90%** for any pupil, we will contact you to discuss this and put in any additional support needed. Persistent absence can also result in a fixed fine.

Each academic year has **190 school days**, this leaves **175 non-school days** for family time, holidays, visits and appointments. If a pupil is absent for just **1 day** each term that equals **6 days** or **39 hours** a year of lost learning.

Please ensure you are **on time too** – school starts at **8.40am** – it is important that children are here on time so that they **start the day well and can engage with their crew**. Gates will shut promptly at **8.50am** after the half term break.

Attendance at school enables us all to build a strong crew and to strengthen our learning powers. Our overall attendance for whole school is currently **96.4%** which is **1.3%** *above* the national figure and **1.8%** above other North West schools – let's all work on keeping this figure above **97%**.
