
Lego Masters


Routines

If your child is arriving at 9:00am everyday they have missed out 1hr 40minutes a week of learning which over a term really mounts up.



School Performance

Around about this time of year there will be the publication of league tables in the local newspaper and online. This is based upon the result of last year's Y6 children. As you can see from the graphs below our results are significantly higher than National and other local authority schools for 2018 with a trend of improvement year on year. This is as a direct result of the detailed analysis that we undertake each year and the improvements that are made to teaching and learning.



However, it is important to note that this data is only one measure of our school and we continually judge ourselves on our vision for each child to have 'A love for learning'. This is evident through our ongoing development of the curriculum and the response from children and parents. Our recent STEAM Community Day was an excellent example of our curriculum in action will many comments from parents;

'I just wanted to thank you for organising the STEAM event on Friday. It was great to learn some more about it & see it all in action. The children were obviously all engaged & happy & there was a relaxed atmosphere throughout the school.'
