Both of my children are always inspired and excited to go to school each day, which speaks volumes. Importantly I feel Kelsall School has always encouraged my children to be confident, self-assured little people. The emphasis on arts within the school is absolutely inspiring, especially in the current educational climate, where this is so often neglected. I will be very sad to see my eldest leave in July.

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#### Additional comments;

More notice of school events and plans

Some events can be poorly planned or thought out and some time needs to be spent on more the school office can run more efficiently and effectively

The office and the wider school team work hard to ensure that any events planned are communicated to you in a timely fashion. There are some occasions when information needs to be sent ahead of a newsletter or indeed when we get late notice of an event. We will continue to utilise PING to send you messages and will continue to plan in advance as much as possible.

I think that the school's move to put all homework on line is not the best course of action. There are significant problems with the software for a number of children, making it inaccessible. Furthermore kids today do too much on line and I think we should move back to homework books with homework tailored to a child.

I don't think computer based homework that is unmarked and without child feedback works at this age. Children need to know their efforts are seen by their teacher and receive positive feedback.

It has taken a great deal of time to find a solution to homework that supports the curriculum and learning taking place in school. The online tools enable teachers to allocate homework efficiently and timely linked to the area of Maths (MyMaths) or Reading (BugClub) that they are working on in that particular week. We will always support with technical difficulties. We will review our feedback on homework through staff meetings. The vast majority (88%) are comfortable with homework so we will continue with the online content whilst also encouraging 'a love for learning' in self-directed learning at home which we are always happy to see.

I feel the children especially girls, would benefit from more sport activity and competitions

As a school we have increased the number of tournaments and events that we enter. Miss Creek and Miss Cadwallader are our Sports Champions and work hard to organise and support equal opportunity for all of our pupils, including ensuring our children are active and benefit from many different sporting activities; ranging from external coaches in cricket, football, handball and hockey to after school club sports clubs and a range of competitions linked to Tarporley High School and the Cheshire Sports Partnership.

My only concern is that at the end of the day when children leave the school there is no 'check' that parents have arrived to collect their children. I do worry about this as other schools only release children when a teacher knows a parent has arrived.

We will ensure that a member of staff is on the school gates at the end of each day to check that children do not leave the premises on their own. Children are told clearly that if parents are not on the playground they should come back inside school and wait to be collected.

As always, if you have any concerns about your child or school please do let me know. I appreciate the strong partnerships that we have with our parent community and this survey highlights that we are working well as a TEAM but there is always more that we can do. Alongside this newsletter I have attached our Kelsall Curriculum Statement. Our innovative and creative approach has resulted in other schools wanting to find out more and adopt some of our practice. We will continue to adapt and change to meet the needs of all of our learners in our inclusive school. Thank you for your participation in the survey and your continued support of Kelsall School.
